

City Council Meeting Minutes

February 16, 2021

The meeting of the Frontenac City Council, February 16, 2021, was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mayor Fornelli. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

Roll call was answered by Mayor David Fornelli, Tom Sighel, LaDonna Pyle, Mike Snow, Marc McCully, Lynn Grant, Joe Martin, Pat Clinton, and David Hogard.

Also present was the Police Chief, Fire Chief, Public Works Director, City Attorney, City Administrator, and City Clerk.

Clinton made a motion, seconded by McCully to approve the agenda. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Minutes from the February 1, 2021 council meeting was opened for discussion. Grant made a motion, seconded by Sighel, to approve the minutes. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Appropriation Ordinance #1785 was opened for discussion. A motion to approve Appropriation Ordinance #1785 was made by McCully, seconded by Pyle. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

The Council continued the discussion on anti-tethering of dogs, the Council mutually agreed to not make any additions to Ordinance 2018-07.

Snow made a motion, seconded by Clinton to approve Ordinance 2021-02 the Second Amendment to the City's Revolving Sewer Loan for the purchase of sewer flow meters. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Pyle made a motion, seconded by McCully to approve the purchase of the property located at 5011 Parkview Drive in the amount of \$60,000.00 and the southeast corner of the property located at 806 West McKay Street in the amount of \$2,500.00. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 6:58 pm, Snow motioned, seconded by Pyle, to recess into executive session for 5 minutes for Non-Elected Personnel regarding the Court Clerk Position. The session included the City Council, Mayor, City Administrator, City Clerk, Police Chief and City Attorney. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 7:03 pm, the Council returned to regular session. Pyle made a motion, seconded by Clinton to hire Christina Lucas as the full-time Court Clerk. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 7:03 pm, Snow motioned, seconded by Sighel, to recess into executive session for 5 minutes for Attorney Client Privilege regarding the State Law Interpretation. The session included the City Council, Mayor, City Administrator, City Clerk, and City Attorney. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 7:08 pm, the Council returned to regular session with no action being taken.

Zafuta updated the Council on the following:
