

City Council Meeting Minutes

March 1, 2021

The meeting of the Frontenac City Council, March 1, 2021, was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mayor Fornelli. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

Roll call was answered by Mayor David Fornelli, Tom Sighel, LaDonna Pyle, Mike Snow, Lynn Grant, Joe Martin, Pat Clinton, and David Hogard. Marc McCully was absent.

Also present was the Police Sergeant, Fire Chief, Public Works Director, City Attorney, City Administrator, and City Clerk.

Pyle made a motion, seconded by Clinton to approve the agenda. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Minutes from the February 16, 2021 council meeting was opened for discussion. Sighel made a motion, seconded by Grant, to approve the minutes. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Appropriation Ordinance #1786 was opened for discussion. A motion to approve Appropriation Ordinance #1786 was made by Snow, seconded by Hogard. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Snow made a motion, seconded by Pyle to approve the re-zoning of the three properties located behind 4032 Parkview Drive owned by Kirk Darrow from R-1 to C-S. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Martin made a motion, seconded by Grant to approve Resolution 2021-01 the GAAP Waiver for the City of Frontenac. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Grant made a motion, seconded by Martin to approve Resolution 2021-02 to set the public hearing for a Community Improvement District located 1007 US 69 Hwy, Frontenac, Kansas. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Zafuta gave an update regarding the City's Environmental Code as well as adding a Health Nuisance Code.

Clinton made a motion, seconded by Snow to hire Luten Warrick as a temporary contract laborer for ballpark maintenance. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

City Administrator's Report

Zafuta updated the Council on the following:

- Updates at the Softball Field.
- A Plan will be Submitted to the County Health Officer for the City Pool's 2021 Season.
- Requiring a 10 Foot Hard Surface Approach for New Subdivisions.
- The Renewing of a Quarter Cent Sales Tax for Street Improvements will be on the 2022 Ballot.

Council Members' Comments


Clinton asked for City Staff to look into free range roosters located at 159 E. Atkinson, as she had received a complaint.
