

## City Council Meeting Minutes

April 19, 2021

The meeting of the Frontenac City Council, April 19, 2021, was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mayor Fornelli. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

Roll call was answered by Mayor David Fornelli, Tom Sighel, LaDonna Pyle, Mike Snow, Marc McCully, Lynn Grant, Joe Martin, Pat Clinton, and David Hogard.

Also present was the Police Chief, Fire Chief, Public Works Director, City Attorney, City Administrator, and City Clerk.

Pyle made a motion, seconded by Grant to amend the agenda to reflect the following, add Well Number 4 Bid Acceptance in between line-item number three and four. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Minutes from the April 5, 2021 council meeting was opened for discussion. Snow made a motion, seconded by Clinton, to approve the minutes. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Appropriation Ordinance #1789 was opened for discussion. A motion to approve Appropriation Ordinance #1789 was made by Sighel, seconded by Martin. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

McCully made a motion, seconded by Pyle to accept Midwest Hydro Drilling & Services, Inc. bid proposal for the Municipal Water Supply Well No. 4 project in the amount of \$337,627.00 subject to KDHE review and approval, and authorize the Mayor and City Administrator to sign documents pertaining to the submittal to KDHE. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Charter Ordinance 5 was discussed at length between the council members. Clinton made a motion, seconded by Grant to table Charter Ordinance 5 to the meeting on May 3<sup>rd</sup>. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 6:49 pm, Pyle motioned, seconded by Snow, to recess into executive session for 5 minutes for non-elected personnel regarding a police employee. The session included the City Council, Mayor, City Administrator, City Clerk, City Attorney and the Police Chief. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 6:54 pm, the Council returned to regular session. Clinton made a motion, seconded by McCully to advertise for a part-time dispatch position. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 6:55 pm, Snow motioned, seconded by Hogard, to recess into executive session for 15 minutes for Attorney Client Privilege regarding City Planning. The session included the City Council, Mayor, City Administrator, City Clerk, and City Attorney. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 7:10 pm, the Council returned to regular session with no action being taken.

### Council Members' Comments

Sighel commended fire, police and public works for a job well done at a fire in Capaldo.

Pyle asked when City Hall was going to open, the Mayor informed her that we have been open to the public. She also offered to paint the metal merry-go-round and the metal slide at the Rotary Park.

Grant wanted to remind everyone that the filing deadline was June 1<sup>st</sup> for the 2022 election.


