

City Council Meeting Minutes

May 17, 2021

The meeting of the Frontenac City Council, May 17, 2021, was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mayor Fornelli. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

Roll call was answered by Mayor David Fornelli, Tom Sighel, Mike Snow, Marc McCully, Joe Martin, Pat Clinton, and David Hogard. LaDonna Pyle and Lynn Grant were absent.

Also present was the Police Chief, Fire Chief, Public Works Director, City Attorney, City Administrator, and City Clerk.

Hogard made a motion, seconded by McCully to amend the agenda to add between line-item 4 and 5 CMB approval for the American Legion and add between line-item 8 and 9 a (15) minute executive session regarding City Planning Contractual Agreement. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Minutes from the May 3, 2021 council meeting was opened for discussion. McCully made a motion, seconded by Clinton, to approve the minutes. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Minutes from the May 12, 2021 special council meeting was opened for discussion. Clinton made a motion, seconded by Martin, to approve the minutes. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Appropriation Ordinance #1791 was opened for discussion. A motion to approve Appropriation Ordinance #1791 was made by Snow, seconded by Sighel. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Citizens' Comments

Tim Lewellyn with Shorts Trash Service introduced their new supervisor Carl Cox, he also reminded the Council and Community of the City-Wide Cleanup that is being held from 8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. on May 21st and from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. on May 22nd.

Seth Nutt with the Frontenac Homecoming Committee gave a high-level overview of the upcoming events for Frontenac Homecoming being held on June 3rd through June 6th.

McCully made a motion, seconded by Snow to approve a temporary CMB license for the American Legion. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Snow made a motion, seconded by Sighel to approve Resolution 2021-05, Street Closing for Frontenac Homecoming. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Snow made a motion, seconded by Sighel to approve Resolution 2021-06, Frontenac Homecoming Alcohol Consumption. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Hogard made a motion, seconded by McCully to approve the 2021 Street Paving Project. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 6:47 pm, Snow motioned, seconded by Sighel, to recess into executive session for 15 minutes for attorney client privilege regarding City Planning Contractual Agreement. The session included the City Council, Mayor, City Administrator, City Clerk, and the City Attorney. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 7:02 pm, the Council returned to regular session with no action being taken.

McCully made a motion, seconded by Snow to allow Medicalodge to have their firework display on June 25th with the approval of the Fire Chief. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

City Administrator's Report

Zafuta updated the Council on the following:

- Striping of certain streets along with the 2021 paving project.
- The City is estimated to receive \$470,000 of Federal Funding to be used for infrastructure.
- The City pool is scheduled to open over Memorial Weekend pending the arrival of chlorine.

Council Members' Comments

Snow congratulated the Frontenac Golf team as they qualified for the State Tournament. He informed the Council that the Frontenac Softball Team will be playing on May 18th at 11:00 a.m. at Pitt State and the Frontenac Baseball Team will be playing at 2:00 p.m. at Girard.


Mayor Fornelli congratulated the 2021 Frontenac Seniors on their recent graduation.
