

City Council Meeting Minutes

June 21, 2021

The meeting of the Frontenac City Council, June 21, 2021, was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mayor Fornelli. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

Roll call was answered by Mayor David Fornelli, Tom Sighel, LaDonna Pyle, Mike Snow, Marc McCully, Lynn Grant, Joe Martin, Pat Clinton, and David Hogard.

Also present was the Police Chief, Fire Chief, Public Works Director, City Attorney, City Administrator, and City Clerk.

McCully made a motion, seconded by Grant to approve the agenda. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Minutes from the June 7, 2021 council meeting was opened for discussion. Grant made a motion, seconded by Clinton, to approve the minutes. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Appropriation Ordinance #1793 was opened for discussion. A motion to approve Appropriation Ordinance #1793 was made by Snow, seconded by Sighel. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Citizens' Comments

Nina Strong, 107 E. Leighton, expressed her concerns regarding the properties located to the west of her residence. Mayor Fornelli stated he would have the city's Codes Enforcement Officer inspect the properties located at 103, 105 and 106 E. Leighton.

Martin made a motion, seconded by Pyle to approve the Authority to Award Contract Commitment of City Funds. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 6:37 pm, Snow motioned, seconded by McCully, to recess into executive session for 10 minutes for non-elected personnel regarding police employees. The session included the City Council, Mayor, City Administrator, City Clerk, Police Chief and the City Attorney. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 6:47 pm, the Council returned to regular session. Pyle made a motion, seconded by Clinton to approve the hiring of a full-time police officer and a full-time SRO. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Council Members' Comments

Sighel ask city staff to look in to adding more handicap parking spaces at the ballparks. He also wanted to know if golf carts and UTV were considered motorized vehicles, as many are driving past the no motorized vehicle signs at the ballparks during league games.

Pyle stated she would like for the pool employees to call the people attending swimming lessons if lessons are canceled for the day, as not all people have Facebook to see the notifications. Pyle also inquired about the business at the corner of McKay and Cayuga and asked if the city could require them to put up a fence.


Snow stated that the lights on field 5 were not working, Mjelde advised that they have been fixed.
