

City Council Meeting Minutes

July 6, 2021

The meeting of the Frontenac City Council, July 6, 2021, was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mayor Fornelli. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

Roll call was answered by Mayor David Fornelli, Tom Sighel, LaDonna Pyle, Mike Snow, Marc McCully, Joe Martin, and Pat Clinton. Lynn Grant and David Hogard were absent.

Also present was the Police Chief, Fire Chief, Public Works Director, City Attorney, City Administrator, and City Clerk.

Clinton made a motion, seconded by McCully to approve the agenda. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Minutes from the June 21, 2021 council meeting was opened for discussion. Snow made a motion, seconded by Sighel, to approve the minutes. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Appropriation Ordinance #1794 was opened for discussion. A motion to approve Appropriation Ordinance #1794 was made by Martin, seconded by Pyle. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Citizens' Comments

Jason Hipfl, Hipfl Construction, expressed his concerns regarding the recent thefts within the city.

Kirk Darrow, Darrow Automotive, wanted an update on the vacate of the alley behind his property as well as the improvement progress of the existing alley.

At 6:45 pm, Pyle motioned, seconded by Sighel, to recess into executive session for 10 minutes for non-elected personnel regarding police employees. The session included the City Council, Mayor, City Administrator, City Clerk, Police Chief and the City Attorney. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 6:55 pm, the Council returned to regular session. Pyle made a motion, seconded by Sighel to approve the hiring of Aubrey Groter as the part-time administrative assistant at \$13.75 per hour. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.


Council Members' Comments
