

City Council Meeting Minutes

September 20, 2021

The meeting of the Frontenac City Council, September 20, 2021, was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mayor David Fornelli. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

Roll call was answered by Tom Sighel, LaDonna Pyle, Mike Snow, Marc McCully, Lynn Grant, Joe Martin, Pat Clinton, and David Hogard.

Also present was the Police Chief, Police Sergeant, Public Works Director, City Attorney, City Administrator, and City Clerk.

Hogard made a motion, seconded by Clinton to approve the agenda. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Minutes from the September 7, 2021 council meeting was opened for discussion. Pyle made a motion, seconded by Sighel, to approve the minutes. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Appropriation Ordinance #1799 was opened for discussion. A motion to approve Appropriation Ordinance #1799 was made by McCully, seconded by Clinton. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Grant made a motion, seconded by Snow to approve Charter Ordinance No. 6 Library. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Governing Body.

The Council had an in-depth discussion regarding the status of Norma Road.

McCully made a motion, seconded by Clinton to approve the sale of the property located at 5011 Parkview Drive to Kenneth Hale Jr. The motion was voted upon and approved by the Council with a 5 to 3 vote.

Sergeant/Building Inspector Adam Harrison gave the Council a high-level overview on the permitting and inspection process.

Pyle inquired about starting the condemnation process for several properties within the city.


Snow stated that the t-ball field renovation turned out great. He thanked the fire department for doing a great job at the snake dance.

With no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Snow, seconded by Grant. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.


