

City Council Meeting Minutes

November 15, 2021

The meeting of the Frontenac City Council, November 15, 2021, was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mayor David Fornelli. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

Martin asked for an update on the library.


Snow informed everyone that the Frontenac High School Football Team will be playing the sub-state championship game at home Friday night at 6:00 p.m. against Holton.
