

City Council Meeting Minutes

April 4, 2022

The meeting of the Frontenac City Council, April 4, 2022, was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mayor David Fornelli. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

Roll call was answered by Mayor David Fornelli, LaDonna Pyle, Mike Snow, Marc McCully, Lynn Grant, Joe Martin, Pat Clinton, Kyle Smalley. Tom Sighel was absent.

Also present was the Fire Chief, Police Chief, Public Works Director, City Attorney, City Administrator, and City Clerk.

Grant made a motion, seconded by Smalley to approve the agenda. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Minutes from the March 21, 2022, council meeting was opened for discussion. McCully made a motion, seconded by martin, to approve the minutes. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Appropriation Ordinance #1812 was opened for discussion. A motion to approve Appropriation Ordinance #1812 was made by Grant, seconded by Martin. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Snow made a motion, seconded by Smalley, to approve the purchase from Conrad Fire Equipment totaling \$17,076.78. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

McCully made a motion, seconded by Grant, to approve the 2022-2023 EMC Insurance Renewal. The motion was voted upon and approved by the Council with a 5 to 2 vote.

McCully made a motion, seconded by Clinton, to approve the Notice of Public Hearing on the property located at 4089 Parkview Drive. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Pyle made a motion, seconded by Smalley, to approve the Notice of Public Hearing on the property located at 103 W. North County Rd. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 6:44 pm, McCully motioned, seconded by Clinton, to recess into executive session for 10 minutes for non-elected personnel regarding Public Safety. The session included the City Council, Mayor, Police Chief, City Administrator, City Clerk, and City Attorney. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 6:54 pm, the Council returned to regular session. Pyle made a motion, seconded by Grant, to approve promoting Justin Barnett to the full-time dispatcher with a pay increase to \$16.34 per hour. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Snow made a motion, seconded by Smalley, to approve opening a part-time, nights and weekends dispatch position. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 6:55 pm, McCully motioned, seconded by Snow, to recess into executive session for 10 minutes for attorney client privilege regarding a Development Agreement. The session included the City Council, Mayor, City Administrator, City Clerk, and City Attorney. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 7:05 pm, the Council returned to regular session. Snow made a motion, seconded by Pyle, to approve the Letter of Intent with Porchlight Development. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.
