

City Council Meeting Minutes

June 20, 2022

The meeting of the Frontenac City Council, June 20, 2022, was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mayor David Fornelli. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

Roll call was answered by Mayor David Fornelli, LaDonna Pyle, Tom Sighel, Mike Snow, Marc McCully, Lynn Grant, Joe Martin, Pat Clinton, and Kyle Smalley.

Also present was the Police Chief, Fire Chief, Public Works Director, City Attorney, City Administrator, and City Clerk.

McCully made a motion, seconded by Snow to approve the agenda. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Minutes from the June 6, 2022, council meeting was opened for discussion. Pyle made a motion, seconded by Grant, to approve the minutes. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Appropriation Ordinance #1817 was opened for discussion. A motion to approve Appropriation Ordinance #1817 was made by Grant, seconded by Clinton. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

CMB Special Event Permit

Motion made by Snow, seconded by Sighel to approve the CMB Special Event Permit for EK Enterprise. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Planning & Zoning

Motion made by McCully, seconded by Clinton to accept the Planning and Zoning Board's recommendation to approve the Special Use Permit for Kimberly Lawrence at 106 S. Sugarcreek Rd. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Motion made by Pyle, seconded by Grant to accept the Planning and Zoning Board's recommendation to deny the re-zoning request by Chris Windsor for the properties located at 1024 and 1026 N. Hwy 69. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Police & Public Works Trucks

Motion made by Snow, seconded by Smalley to approve the purchase of 2 police trucks and 1 public works truck through Jay Hatfield. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

2022 Street Paving

Motion made by McCully, seconded by Pyle to approve the bid from Heckert Construction for the 2022 street improvements totaling \$305,365.40. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Old Business

Clinton asked if John Zafuta had reached out to Gerry Dennett regarding the drainage situation on Wright Street.

Martin would like for the Council to provide questions regarding old business to Zafuta prior to each meeting that way he has time to prepare.

McCully stated that Jeff Strahan would like for the city to consider helping with the cost for some improvements to the front of his businesses located on McKay St.

Sighel had some questions for Mr. Little, who had voiced his concerns with the property located at 103 W. North County Rd. earlier in the meeting


Council Members’ Comments

With no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Sighel, seconded by Smalley. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.


