

## City Council Meeting Minutes

July 5, 2022

The meeting of the Frontenac City Council, July 5, 2022, was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mayor David Fornelli. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

Roll call was answered by Mayor David Fornelli, LaDonna Pyle, Tom Sighel, Marc McCully, Joe Martin, and Pat Clinton. Mike Snow, Lynn Grant, and Kyle Smalley were absent.

Also present was the Police Chief, Fire Chief, Public Works Director, City Attorney, City Administrator, and City Clerk.

Pyle made a motion, seconded by Sighel to approve the agenda. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Minutes from the June 20, 2022, council meeting was opened for discussion. Clinton made a motion, seconded by McCully, to approve the minutes. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Appropriation Ordinance #1818 was opened for discussion. A motion to approve Appropriation Ordinance #1818 was made by Sighel, seconded by Pyle. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

### **Citizen's Comments**

Seth Nutt with Frontenac Mining Days thanked the council for their financial support as well as the support received from City Hall, Public Safety, and Public Works.

John Williamson, 107 Johns Ct., voiced his concerns regarding the sewer backing up into his home from the large rainfall in May.

### **Resolution 2022-06**

Motion made by McCully, seconded by Martin to approve Resolution 2022-06, City Boundaries. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

### **Executive Session**

At 6:50 pm, Pyle motioned, seconded by Sighel, to recess into executive session for 20 minutes for non-elected personnel regarding Personnel Policies. The session included the City Council, Mayor, City Administrator, City Clerk, and City Attorney. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 7:10 pm, the Council returned to regular session.

Zafuta gave the Council a high-level overview of the proposed 2023 budget.

Martin would like for Zafuta to budget for stripping of heavy traffic roads throughout town.

McCully asked for an update on the property located at 103 W. North County Rd.


Sighel thanked the Police Department and the Fire Department for making the Capaldo 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade a success.
