

## City Council Meeting Minutes

October 17, 2022

The meeting of the Frontenac City Council, October 17, 2022, was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mayor David Fornelli. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

Roll call was answered by, Mayor David Fornelli, Tom Sighel, LaDonna Pyle, Mike Snow, Marc McCully, Joe Martin, Pat Clinton, and Kyle Smalley. Lynn Grant was absent.

Also present was the Police Chief, Assistant Police Chief, Fire Chief, Public Works Director, City Attorney, City Administrator, and City Clerk.

Sighel made a motion, seconded by Smalley to approve the agenda. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Minutes from the October 3, 2022, council meeting was opened for discussion. Pyle made a motion, seconded by Clinton, to approve the minutes. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Appropriation Ordinance #1825 was opened for discussion. A motion to approve Appropriation Ordinance #1825 was made by McCully, seconded by Martin. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 6:31 pm, Pyle motioned, seconded by Sighel, to recess into executive session for 15 minutes for non-elected personnel regarding Public Safety. The session included the City Council, Mayor, City Administrator, City Clerk, Police Chief, Assistant Police Chief, and City Attorney. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 6:46 pm, the Council returned to regular session. Pyle motioned, seconded by Snow to hire Jesse Spencer as a full-time police officer. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Martin thanked Zafuta and Harrison for the work they did on the Transportation Alternatives Grant.


Clinton asked for an update on the overpass, Zafuta stated that city staff has a meeting with Triad Engineering this coming Wednesday.
